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
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SKIN HEALTH | LEE GAVEGAN Stomal Therapy Nurse ONL 2022

"Skin Health" are the words we see used now as the umbrella term for varying types of skin conditions. These may be planned (operation) or unplanned (emergency, accidental, or trauma) interruption(s) to the skin. Health professionals are trying to use a common language to communicate or pass on a message(s) about skin conditions. Common interruptions that the "Skin Health" umbrella covers are general wounds (operations), plastics (skin graft) wounds, vascular (blood supply) wounds, leg ulcers, dermatological conditions, pressure injuries (bed sores), skin tears, continence-related skin injuries and most important to us peristomal skin conditions/complications (PSC).

We know that the skin is our largest organ and what an amazing one it is? It holds everything in blood vessels, muscles, etc. and alerts us to pain, cold or heat, irritation and excessive moisture. Acts as a barrier to infection from organisms by keeping a pH layer called the "acid mantle" of 4.5 to 5.5. It helps regulate our temperature by allowing moisture to move out in the form of perspiration and around past the skin cells called transepidermal water loss. Our skin will hold 17.7 km of blood vessels and weigh on average about 4.8kg. Our skin cells generally renew themselves every thirty (30) days. Our thinnest skin is on our eyelids.

Our skin is in three layers. Epidermis the narrowest, outer layer and this houses the melanocytes responsible for hair, eye and skin colour and aids in the production of Vitamin D. Dermis is the middle layer and this has most of the nerves, blood vessels, hair follicles, connective tissue and glands. This protective layer has the ability to destroy toxins, bacteria, or impurities that may have crept past the epidermis. Hypodermis has connective tissue that gives strength and support. This layer also has a fat layer which acts as a cushion for added protection.





EPIDERMIS Protection from injury, Excessive water loss, foreign body identification **DERMIS** Melatonin production, Vit D production, Heat regulation and cooling, Pain sensation **SUBCUTANEOUS TISSUE** Loose connective tissue & fat (adipose tissue), Cushion, Energy store

In a recent consensus study published in 2022 **peri**stomal skin is called that where the skin is closest around the stoma and **para**stomal is that skin on each side of the stoma but still covered by the ostomy appliance. Also published this year in the European Journal of Public Health was information that peristomal skin conditions / complications "are one of the main post-operative complications after ostomy surgery". These complications cause a reduced quality of life for ostomates as well as representation to hospital and ongoing involvement with the stomaltherapist and other health professionals. This paper reported that PSC as low as 11% but may be as high as **45%**.

For your own peristomal and parastomal skin health is important to remember these steps.

- Always remove your appliance gently and parallel to your skin.
- Roll down rather than rip off.
- Clean gently with soft cloth and water (especially if using a remover spray/wipe)
- $\boldsymbol{\cdot}$ Dry well prior to applying new pouch
- $\boldsymbol{\cdot}$ Do not use baby wipes or scented towels to clean or dry.
- Make sure there is a snug fit around stoma
- Weight gain or weight loss may affect the peristomal skin, review may be needed.
- $\boldsymbol{\cdot}$ Take a picture and send to your stoma nurse if concerned.
- $\boldsymbol{\cdot}$ Do not hesitate to ask questions. Easier to solve problems earlier rather than later.
- $\boldsymbol{\cdot}$ Keep in contact with your Stoma Nurse.

Peristomal skin - The skin immediately surrounding your stoma(s) Some people may have two stomas. A urinary and faecal stoma still should have the same peristomal skin colour.

After more than 2 vears of Covid restrictions we were finally able to meet in person and hold an Education and Information Day. The event also coincided with National Stomal Therapy week. Now I feel like I am part of a family'. The day was all about the members and there was lots of opportunity to ask questions and meet other members.

The suppliers commented on how busy they were, and the amount of interest in new products as well as questions relating to existing products being used. Mary Egan from NSW Stoma and Stephen Lardner

from Ostomy NSW spoke about our associations and how we assist members with product supply, enquiries and information from various sources. They explained the complexity of managing the Stoma Appliance Scheme, which is world-class in its generosity and rigorous in the execution by associations.

There is always a great mix of presenters and content and the Sydney meeting was no exception. Mathew Boyd-Skinner spoke about his journey becoming an ostomate at a young age and the support he has received. As a young person whose life had been difficult, he inspired us with his story including a recent success directing a stage play of Joseph and His Amazing Technicolour Dreamcoat. Carol Quast has a journey that commenced with a bowel cancer screening test many years ago - a test that both changed and saved her life. She is now an avid international traveller. hard working educator and volunteer at NSW Stoma.

From hearing stories from fellow ostomates, our attention is drawn to clinical presentations from experienced STNs. Anne Marie Lyons presented on Understanding Stomas which takes us through knowledge of the various types of stoma, and where they are formed within the small bowel or ureters. She explains understanding your stoma assists the correct management of your stoma. A healthy stoma is normal and irregularities should be attended to by an experienced stomal therapy nurse.

Lee Gavegan, Stomal Therapy Nurse, then presented Parastomal Hernias, an issue that affects more than half of ostomates and can be treated with care and support. Lee spoke about signs to look out



for to ensure management of the parastomal hernia with correct fitting appliances and support garments.

A huge thank you to our STNs, Lee Gavegan and Anne Maree Lyons, who generously give their time and share their extensive knowledge. We could not run these days without them. Our Q&A session that concluded the day was joined by Rachel Hodgkins STN. There is a safe environment at these sessions and we are prepared to open up in discussions and share experiences. This was clearly shown with the openness of questions and the feedback provided by professionals and members alike.

Another big thank you to Carol Quast, whose time and effort in arranging the day, and then speaking on the day about her own experiences as an ostomate, was so valuable. Carol's tips and tricks for living with stoma should not be missed.

"As a new stomal therapy nurse, I am planning to further train under my senior stomal therapist. Her remarkable work has inspired me to follow her footsteps. Under her guidance, I would like to enhance my knowledge and develop skills in this specialised field of nursing.

Moreover, I would like to develop leadership skills to guide my colleagues and student nurses in caring for ostomates. My aim is to provide current, evidence-based nursing care for patients. I have encountered complex stomas and wounds in my current workplace hence, I would like to be able to create clinical decisions, in collaboration with other members of the healthcare team, that would contribute to improving my patient's condition. My goal is to assist patients in restoring them back to health, adjust to a new life with a stoma and provide emotional support during the times they are most vulnerable. In addition, I would like to assist in establishing a stoma clinic in our



hospital because of the increasing demand for these services.

WHAT PRODUCTS ARE AVAILABLE ON THE STOMA APPLIANCE SCHEME?



This is a question that is raised in our various member events and through phone conversations. Many members request a full list of the products available. While there is a full schedule of products available from the Department of Health website, we don't recommend using it for a number of reasons. The list of products from the October 2022 schedule was just under 3,900 items. While the list may be of some use to you, please note we recommend it is used with caution, due to:


- **1.** Long list it contains 3,897 different items, and although there are Groups, sub-Groups of like items and descriptions, how to make an informed decision for you cannot be made without clinical consultation.
- 2. How to read allowances (by group and sub-group). Although each item has a monthly or annual allowance, products within Groups and across sub-groups cancel each other out. The Department of Health refers to this "for which the products serve the same purpose". For instance, there are listed monthly allowances of two remover sprays and two remover wipes, but not together in one month. You may only receive 100% of the allowance for like products. In most instances, a base plate is a base plate; a bag is a bag and seals are seals. Even though they may serve different purposes (convex, flat, closed or drainable) the monthly allowance is still only 100% of any combination.
- **3.** The same is true of Support Garments the annual allowance is 6 briefs/boxers or

- 3 support belts, or a combination of both up to 100% of the allowance (for example 2 belts and 2 briefs is the maximum annual allowance).
- **4.** All allowances are in units. If the allowance is 30 and one box is 30, that is the maximum monthly allowance. If a box contains 10, you may be able to select a multiple of items, as long as the total allowance is still 100% or less
- **5.** We will not split cartons to allow for combinations of items.

Restrictions – some items have restrictions attached to them. These are designated by the letter "R" and a number (R1, R2, etc.). The explanation for these is:

- **R1 -** Requires STN, Nurse Practitioner, Registered Nurse or Registered Medical Professional authorisation.
- **R2** No authority for an increase in the yearly allocation can be granted.

ARTICLE



- **R3** Strict Usage Restriction Requires STN, Nurse Practitioner, Registered Nurse or Registered Medical Professional authorisation including clinical justification.
 - **R4** Strict Usage Restriction Requires Colorectal or General Surgeon authorisation.
- **6.** Two-piece appliances not all bags and base plates fit each other, there are combinations for the attachment of each item within brands and within types of products.

The list should also be read in conjunction with the Stoma Appliance Scheme Operational Guidelines – September 2022.

Our association's AGM was held on Saturday 19th November to review the financial report of the association to 30 June 2022 and elect new directors to our board. The board is pleased to advise that Peter Bettini and David Turner were unanimously elected to the board. At the same time, the board accepted the resignation of Michael Rochford following seven years on the board. In addition, long-time President and volunteer at Ostomy NSW, Tom Flood, resigned from his position after thirty-two years of service to ONL. Tom is enjoying a well-earned retirement and continues to have good health living up on the Central Coast. The board and all our members extend our grateful thanks to the time and energy shown by both Michael and Tom over many years.

Revenue from sales, fees and postage has increased in the past twelve months up from \$902k to \$982k. Medicare also increased by \$12k. The increased income results in an increased Gross Profit of \$1.4m, which almost covers our costs for the year.

Expenses Operational costs have increased primarily due to postal charges from Aust Post and rent on our premises. The Administrative costs of running the office remain quite stable. There has been a steady decline in the cost of people, which has been achieved with increased volunteers, changes in personnel due to retirements, and provision for leave being used up.



ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING OF OSTOMY NSW LIMITED

Our association's AGM was held on Saturday 19th November to review the financial report of the association to 30 June 2022 and elect new directors to our board. The board is pleased to advise that Peter Bettini and David Turner were unanimously elected to the board. At the same time, the board accepted the resignation of Michael Rochford following seven years on the board. In addition, long-time President and volunteer at Ostomy NSW, Tom Flood, resigned from his position after thirty-two years of service to ONL. Tom is enjoying a well-earned retirement and continues to have good health living up on the Central Coast. The board and all our members extend our grateful thanks to the time and energy shown by both Michael and Tom over many years.

The Vice President report

Good day fellow Ostomates As portrayed by our Kangaroo, your Association has focused on keeping your pouch attached. We have progressed through Covid with logistic disruptions providing a stable item supply. Huge thanks to staff and volunteers who have absorbed the disruptions to keep us in products. Perhaps products were a day or three later than in 2019. In 2021 we published the 3 ostomate surveys and in mid-2022 we issued a member participation survey. Sadly, only some 50 members or 0.90% responded, which is a pity.

ONL continues to engage a professional communication company to enable bulk emails, SMS, Facebook etc to inform members of disruptions and to better connect with members. This has not achieved marked benefits. Providing ONL with your email address enables these communications to continue and adds the benefit of order tracking through Australia Post.

Volunteers are wonderful people. They know the Stoma Appliance Scheme (SAS), relate to members, and provide services at little cost to members. Most are ostomates or relations of ostomates; and they reduce ONL wage costs to members some \$260,000pa. Love them!

The issue of our premises on Princes Highway Kirrawee with continued unit entitlement ownership within the Strata Plan has further progressed to resolutions. In our annual report your directors have provided the following update:

"8a. Directors are engaged with the Strata Plan Committee (SP43344) and other unit owners as to various options for the building and also potential legal action. Decisions rely on a majority vote by strata unit owners. The Strata Plan Committee have obtained property valuations for the damaged building, where if sale realised, ONL entitlement is expected to match or exceed the building asset recorded book value."

The Directors decided in April 2022, with the media talk of inflation, to replace the typical annual SAS access and membership fees increase with a voluntary contribution. We received some 327 contributions or 7% of membership. Whilst this is much less than hoped, our voluntary donation campaign continues until 30 June 2023, planning for \$150,000.

Lack of member interest is surprising. I am a urostomate and without ONLs' role with Federal Government my supplies annual cost for pouches would be \$2,940, wipes \$1,120 and release spray \$180 – a total of \$4,240. My contribution is \$60pa (concession). New revenue needs to be gained to maintain the supply with these cost saving benefits to ostomates. Without increased government funding, ONL will need the continued support of members to be able to provide ongoing quality service.

Importantly, news that Tom Flood is standing down as Emeritus President after 32 years ...we wouldn't exist without Tom.

On behalf of members, a big thank you for those at ONL who volunteer to serve and manage the business; they don't have to. Finally, the Government has left SAS with the ostomate Associations and we expect Government wants ostomates to manage the services for themselves. It could have been very different.

Manager Report

Covid-19 response – We have been able to maintain our service to members throughout the financial year. Whilst there have been many days of staff and volunteer absence, we have been able to cover with our existing team.

Fire Insurance – we are continuing to rent temporary premises and it is only very recently that the owners are close to reaching a consensus on our building insurance claim.

Member meetings – In June we held our first joint meeting with NSW Stoma in Newcastle and October in Sydney. We were pleasantly surprised with around 140 guests at each. We commenced monthly Zoom meetings for new members this year where we present on how the association runs and how to order and an information session such as Skin Health and Diet and Exercise.

Click To Boot – commenced this year and has gained in popularity. This is our alternative to a counter service, with our council not permitting members to come on site, as that is considered retail.

STN Clinic – a new Stomal Therapy Nurse has been employed this year, replacing our retiring STN who left during 2021. All of her consults are via telehealth as we do not have a clinic available on site.

STN Scholarship – We continue to offer scholarship fund support for Registered Nurses (RN) to undertake the Graduate Certificate in Stoma Nursing through the Australian College of Nursing. This year we were able to support three scholarships for RNs in NSW.

Board of Directors – the Board continues to meet monthly to review the operation of ONL and financial reports. All directors are actively involved in the business as volunteers, except we do not see Tom Flood these days. Tom will be retiring from our board at this year's AGM. He is keeping in good health and is unable to travel now to be at our association.

Supplier Performance – there has generally been good support from suppliers by maintaining frequent and consistent supply of products. Where problems have occurred, we have addressed these with suppliers. There is some impact on our delivery performance due all the warehouses being located in Melbourne and only one in Sydney. Most suppliers had periods where items were unavailable due to covid-impacted supply chain.

Working with other associations – We have maintained professional working dialogue and discussions with NSW Stoma during the year, including regular visits to each other's facilities. There have also been discussions with many other associations. We look forward to introducing the Member Portal to our business early in 2023.

Financial Report

We celebrate making another surplus for this year, which has increased our member reserves. This has been assisted by insurance payments that recognised the additional cost to our business over the past two years.

Underlying revenue is static or slightly growing; expenses are increasing faster. Funds are available to maintain the association well into the future.

Total Land & Buildings - \$1,235,361. This is reported at "cost" less depreciation – the price we paid for it. Revaluation is not required for June 2022. The Strata Plan insurance claim on the whole building has been declined and further action is underway to recover the claim. It is expected the premises owned at 555 Princes Hwy Kirrawee will be sold prior to 30 June 2023 end of financial year. The Board will determine how to use the proceeds to further enhance member equity.

Net Working Capital is strong at \$1.65m – cash to use to support members and increased in 2022. Retained Earnings have grown with the 2022 surplus by \$284,000
